The Uniting Church in Australia was inaugurated in 1977, following the union of members of the Methodist Church, the Congregational Church and some congregations of the Presbyterian Church from all states and territories. Presbyterian Church of Queensland (1849 - current)

In 1977, 75 per cent of the Presbyterian Church became part of the Uniting Church in Australia, the remaining 25 per cent continued as the Presbyterian Church.
