Details

The Destitute Board was responsible for a number of homes in South Australia. In 1886, under the provisions of the *Destitute Person's Act Amendment Act*, responsibilities for children in state care, and the management of children's Homes, were transferred to the newly-created State Children's Council. The Board continued to exist and was responsible for the Destitute Asylum.
