

# Swan Homes

1943 – 1959 Other Names

Other Names: • Swan Homes (Boys and Girls)

## Details

Swan Homes, in Middle Swan was created from a merger of two Anglican children's homes in 1943. The Perth Girls' Orphanage was evacuated to Swan Boys' Orphanage at Middle Swan during World War II, and the two children's homes merged into one institution. During this time, the type of accommodation changed from dormitories to large houses on the Middle Swan site. Swan Homes admitted children who were wards of the State, child migrants from Britain, and children placed privately by family or others. In 1960, Swan Homes became Swanleigh.

#### Lee Steere House 1953

**Description:** This is a photograph of the dining room of Freeman House at Swan Homes, later known as Swanleigh. Freeman House was opened in 1955 to accommodate child migrants from the UK and Europe. This photo is one of three taken of Freeman House on 3 August 1955 available at the State Library of Western Australia.

**Description:** This is a photograph of Freeman House at Swan Homes, later known as Swanleigh. It shows a large two-storey brick building.
