## SEAFORTH HISTORY

Commencing from date of earliest available records:

September 11, 1939: Alterations commenced to separate backward boys from

feformatory boys. Renovations to school were also

commenced, by Captains Blewett and Hewitson.

First pigs were bought. February, 1940:

March 16, 1942: Boys from Nedlands Boys' Home were evacuated to Seaforth

for the duration of the war.

Returned to Nedlands. March 1, 1944:

February 1, 1945: Commenced to lay foundations for Trade School.

Boys made all the bricks, (approx.15,000) in four months.

/July/August, 1945: Former Girls' Home was renovated to house boys 2 - 6 yrs.

April 29,1949: No.3 Section separated to become "Eventide Home".

July 29, 1950: "Backward Section" closed.

August 10, 1955: Reformatory closed.

✓ August 30, 1955: Seaforth Boys' Home closed - last of boys transferred

to Nedlands.

Property maintained as Eventide Home and Farm.

January 13, 1956: Tractor, plough, cultivator, super-spreader, mower,

buck rack, spike harrows, transport cart and jack

arrived on farm.

August 23, 1956: Herd of Australian Illawarra SHorthorn donated to farm.

July 2, 1959: First sale of A.I.S. bulls averaging £36 per head.

October 24, 1959: Won 2 Championships at Byford Show.

May 6, 1960: Men moved to Hollywood. Eventide Home closed.

Now known as Seaforth Estate.
